1. At Proston turn left into Rodney Street

3. Travel approximately 1.45 kms to the T-junction
4. Turn right at the T-junction which is still Weir Road (Blanchs Road is the left turn)
5. The Conservation Park is within a few hundred metres on the left, just around the corner from the T-junction
6. If you follow these directions you cannot get lost – please keep in mind that all distances indicated are approximates

LAST MEETING

Wondai State Forest Meeting Sunday 20/5/07

The meeting was held in a large gravel scrape near one of the main entrances to the Wondai State Forest. Business was started at 10:05am with Caroline as Chairman, Joanne taking minutes, Col as our new Treasurer, with 10 other members present. Many items were covered with excellent participation from members, and the meeting closed at 11:45 am.

We then had a fun and lively raffle, with quality produce and plants as prizes, followed by lunch. After a discussion about where to go, and what to see, we WALKED into the forest along the road looking at plants for approximately 150 metres. Then we turned right onto an old, downhill logging track (why do we always go downhill first?), looking at several small *Dodonaea triangularis* (Hop Bush), which had minute flowers.

As we were wandering about, George spotted an Assassin Bug (Family Reduviidae) on a wattle.

This was approximately 20mm in length and black with a rather bright red back, which flew away before Jim could take a photograph. This insect has an extremely painful bite caused from the injection of powerful saliva, which it uses to paralyse prey, prior to sucking up body fluids. George warned us, "do not try to touch them".

As we continued our meander through the forest, two of the highlights were an amazing prostrate specimen of *Psydrax odorata* subsp. *buxifolia*, and an extensive grove of *Olearia elliptica*. I remember on a previous visit to Wondai State Forest that some members wondered if the *Olearia* was in fact Groundsel Bush. Where was Caroline when we needed her then? Gallivanting around the bushland at the Sunshine Coast with another member, who shall remain nameless, and apparently spontaneously deciding to plan mystery bus trips for the rest of us!

We saw, as usual, heaps of interesting plants and natural beauty, amongst them some large *Corymbia citriodora* subsp. *variegata* (Spotted Gums). After browsing for a couple of hours, a few members walked back to their cars. The rest of us circled back around towards the meeting site, and found a stunning, quite low growing, and broad-spreading *Acrotiche aggregata*. We eventually made it back to the cars for another cuppa and a yarn leaving for home around 4:00 pm.

The day was rather cloudy but once again, it did not rain. I considered this an interesting and enjoyable day out. It was also good that someone had their traverse and collection permits handy – just in case we actually had time to drive anywhere in the forest!

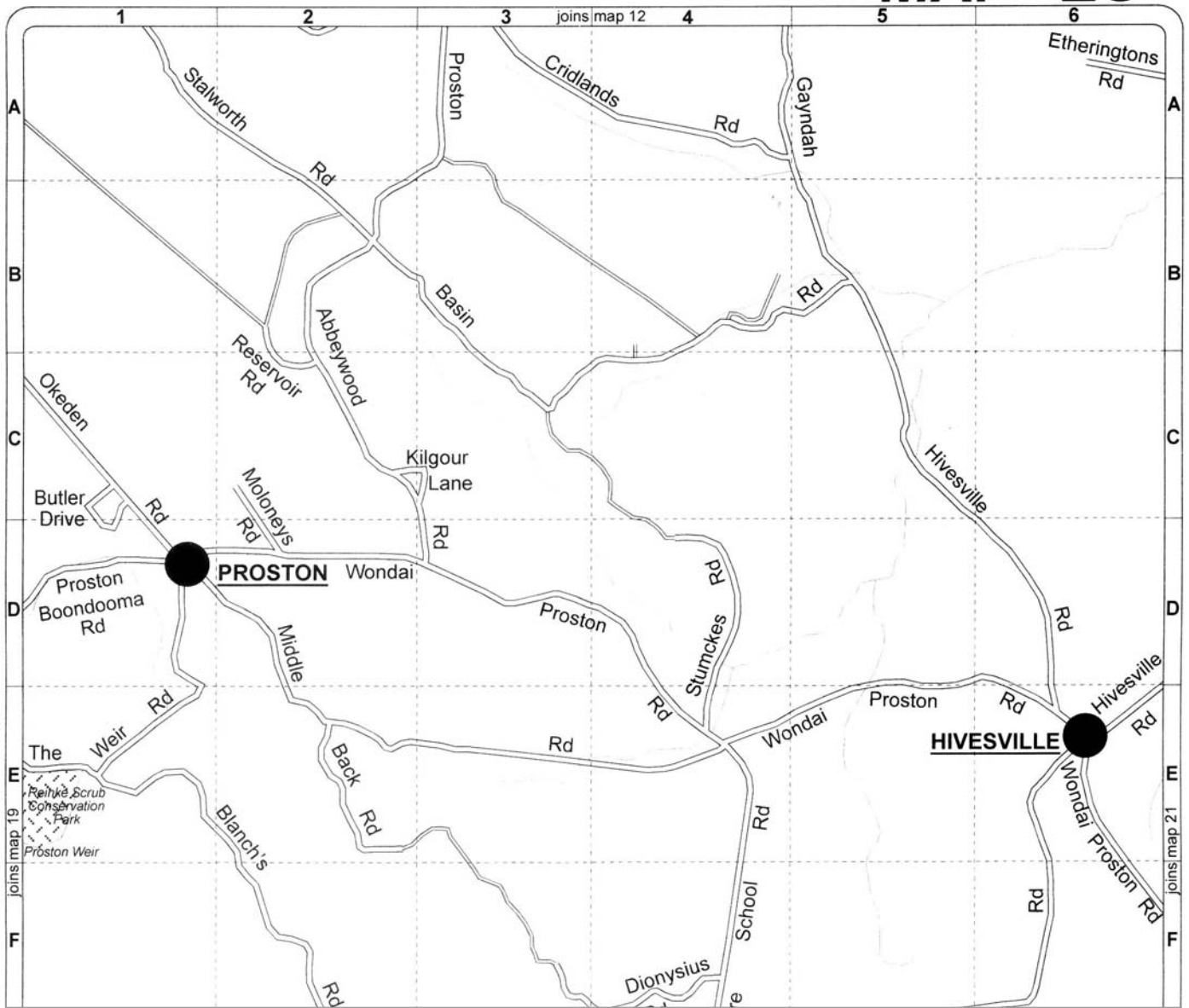
Other Business

- 5.8 Information: South Burnett Local Govt Cluster – an abbreviated NRM project has now been approved by the BMRG. Funding for the biodiversity component was reduced due to concerns regarding capacity to deliver outcomes
- 5.9 Information: Caroline Haskard and Anne Windsor attended a 2-day, regional, 'Back on Track' workshop organised by the BMRG and EPA in Gympie recently, which concentrated on prioritising threatened species in the Burnett Mary region, and identification and prioritisation of threats to those species. Following this, Caroline and Anne spent the next week and a half preparing two submissions for nomination under the federal *Environment Protection for Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC)* for 2 of our most threatened local plant species – *Phebalium distans* and *Lasiopetalum* sp. Proston. This process can take up to 12 months to complete, so it may be a long wait
Special thanks to Caroline and Anne for the work and effort they put into this project
- 5.10 **Discussion:** The plenary session re Qld SGAP Conference in 2008 was held at the SB Enterprise Centre with 10 people attending. A sub-committee sign-up sheet was handed around for people to indicate their participation. An executive decision was made to assist Treasurer Col and appoint Michael Haskard as Special Projects Finance Officer to help manage special activities and projects such as the Conference
